church in countless ways. They took part in Bible Studies and grief share ministries, and they served on the church council. David did a great job serving as Council Treasurer for years, and he later served as Moderator. 

Thanks to David's expertise and influence we were able to negotiate a fair deal with the city when they bought part of our church's property for the expansion of State College Blvd.

During the pandemic we worshipped outside. Following an outdoor worship service, Linda told me she was grateful that we had such beautiful grounds. After consulting with the Hill family, it was decided to set up a memorial on our church grounds. A large tree and rose garden will be planted in honor of David and Linda Hill. Any extra funds will be used to beautify our grounds. Checks can be written to the First Congregational Church and itemized for the Hill memorial.

A Memorial Service will be held for David here at the church on Monday, June 3rd at 11am. Following service, there will be a catered reception. Pray for his son Jon Ryan, wife Naomi, their many children and the rest of the Hill family.
